She headed toward the middle of the lake, but probably was only 25 feet away. Our plan was to put her in the bag with the first girl. So I set the hook and fought her to the net. A soon as she got to the net, Wally ready to bag her, she made a quick 180 but got the hook caught on the outside of the net and thrashing like mad. Not good! After checking things over, I did the only thing possible. I lifted on the side the hook wasn't and flipped her in the bag with the other fish. After getting her unhooked and measured at 38 inches, we headed over to another boat for a picture. It was Steve Reinstra of the Capital City Chapter and his buddy Tom. They graciously snapped a bunch of pictures. I felt like I was in one of those Austin Powers photo shoots. What a great way to end the season!

Muskies in Olson Lake

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources stocked 47 10.75-inch muskies into Olson Lake in Rock Cut State Park in August. It was the first stocking of Olson by the DNR. Olson Lake is only 50 acres so that would be almost a fish an acre if they all survive. It will be awhile before any of those fish are big enough to catch. The DNR stocked 164 10.75-inchers into Pierce Lake, which is 160 acres.

At total of 21,543 muskies, produced at the Jake Wolf hatchery, were stocked into 30 bodies of water.


