Gander Mountain may file bankruptcy as soon as the end of this month, according to multiple reports. If that happens, Gander Mountain will close all 162 stores --Rockford, Janesville, Madison, etc. Gander Mountain responded to the bankruptcy reports with a noncommittal statement that everything is being reviewed. The statement said the company is subject to "economic cycles, changes in our industry and shifts in consumer demand that require us to adapt our business accordingly." What does it mean? There may be a huge going out of business sale coming soon.

Paperwork reminder

If you're going to Canada on our annual Lake of the Woods outing, you need to make sure your Outdoors Card hasn't expired besides getting a license. Don't forget your Remote Access Border Crossing permit. Also, make sure your boat registration is up to date. The Illinois Department of Natural Resources stopped sending out renewal notices in 2013. Registration of watercraft in Illinois is good for three years and expires June 30. Go to the DNR's website, dnr.illinois.gov., click on boating and go to the link "Please use Online Renewal if your boat is currently registered in your name." Follow the instructions from there.
