
All right now the new event!

The contacts in Madison and our folks that have seen his presentation were very impressed. This will be a great preparation for our outing on the Bay of Green Bay Sept. 27-29. We are promoting this event heavily and hope to see a large crowd. We have sent invitations to all the muskie clubs within a two-hour drive of Rockford. Admission is free and open to the public. Both clubs are combining to make a larger joint raffle with a full day guiding fishing for two anglers with Doug on the Bay of Green Bay to be raffled off. I am excited to see our clubs working together for a fun night. We have discussed this event for over a year and Rock Valley Anglers are also looking forward to a joint meeting. We were lucky to get accommodations for both teams at Mylie's Place resort in Morson, about 5 miles from Red Wing Lodge. All the resorts in the area were booking up early due to the Challunge. Red Wing Lodge on Lake of the Woods has hosted this event for the last three years. We have a very talented group of anglers on the teams and we should do well (and have fun!). It will be good to share the resort that week with the Capital City Chapter. We are in the process of setting up a joint event with the Madison-based group early in the week. Go to the DNR's website, dnr.illinois.gov., click on boating and go to the link "Please use Online Renewal if your boat is currently registered in your name." Follow the instructions from there.
