Resolve to catch more big fish in 2015

Happy New Year. We won't have a general membership meeting this month. The Jan. 10 breakfast at Cracker Barrel was our meeting. The next time we'll get together at the VFW is Feb. 26.

Most of us spend the offseason organizing tackle, buying new stuff and learning as much as we can about our favorite sport. It's also a good time to get all your paperwork in order for your big fishing trips.

Paperwork, part 1

If you're not fishing, you're probably thinking about fishing. If you're going to Canada on our annual Lake of the Woods outing, you need to make sure your Outdoors Card hasn't expired besides getting a license. Don't forget your Remote Access Border Crossing permit. Might as well get all of that out of the way before the weather turns nice and you want to fish.

Paperwork, part 2

This has been mentioned in previous newsletters, but it's important enough for regular reminders. You're going to have to take Aquatic Invasive Species training and display a decal on your trailer if you drive through Minnesota with your boat. Even if you don't stop to fish, you need that sticker. Trailer decals are required by July 1, which means those who are going to LOTW next year will have to take the training and get the decal. The online course is \$5. If you want to do it the old-fashioned way and have the forms mailed to you, it will cost \$11. Go to http://trailers.mndnr.gov/ for details.

It's an online course that becomes available Jan. 31.

Bits from the shows and speakersBy Dick Cholke

So far this year it has been only bits and pieces of muskie information. Here are few of those things that were shared:

Duffy Thury,

creator of the Headlock and the Mattlock

Two of his guide friends were fishing the same open water one day with similar lures and methods. The guy with all the planer boards on one side of the boat was out-fishing the balanced spread five to one. Makes you wonder if a schooling affect may make a difference.

Lake Vermilion during the shad/may fly hatch: Look for the humps on the mud flats during the hottest part of the day -2 p.m. to 4 p.m. and troll. Typically he is in 40 feet of water with the lures running in the top 10 feet. He was very enthusiastic about this pattern (LOTW trip/mayflies??)

St. Croix River has a depression next to shore caused by the wave action. Muskies will lay in that trough. Troll with planer boards and keep the lure in that trough. He normally trolls downstream. Trolling is more effective because the lure stays in the strike zone.

Capital City January presentation.

Cave Run usually has dirty water during the cold water of spring and fall. Late June – mid July fish Bondy baits or Rippin' Dawgs through the bait fish balls. The bait should be jigged so the bait comes up into the baitball and then drop below the baitball. You must use traditional sonar to see bait on the graph. He tries to keep the bait / line near vertical while he has the trolling motor set to run approximately 2 mph. You must fish this pattern by watching the depth finder. Flat bellied lures like a Bull Dawg will drop slower than round bellied lures such as the Red October. He uses various riggings on the Red October when he fishes different depths. He will use the Red October to run deep and fast, with additional weight to get the lure down faster. He may add a nail, lead etc. in the lure for additional weight.

He has found paddle tail style rubber baits very effective in water less than 40°F. To fix large plastic lures/Bull Dawgs with large cuts he uses a heated pocket knife. He places the hot blade into the cut, removes the blade and squeezes the cut together. Water in the cut of a white lure will turn the fix black.

He indicated many of us have problems with our Bull Dawgs getting "Dawg Balls" – the line caught in the hooks, the tail getting caught on the front hooks etc. Most the time this occurs when we try to power a cast and the lure will tumble through the air on the cast. He recommends letting a few feet of line out and lobe the lure out.

Greg now fishes Cave Run in March, April and May and Lake St. Claire the rest of the year. He indicated after the presentation, it's hard to stay away from St. Claire fish factory.

I brought a smile to his face when I asked him last year's question: What did you learn or do different to start catching muskies consistently. After a pause, Greg answered the same as many "time on the water." I added joining Muskie Inc has helped a lot and he strongly agreed.
