Make sure your boat registration is up to date. The Illinois Department of Natural Resources stopped sending out renewal notices in 2013. Registration of watercraft in Illinois is good for three years and expires June 30.

Go to the DNR's website, dnr.illinois.gov., click on boating and go to the link "Please use Online Renewal if your boat is currently registered in your name." Follow the instructions from there.

A few notes from Lee Tauchen's presentation:

Lee Tauchen takes out the two hooks and put one larger treble at the bump at the bottom of the 4" Phantom. He likes that bait. He said that modification makes the bait work better - more like the larger Phantoms. The guys next to me also like that bait. And Lee:

Likes smaller single bladed bucktails #8 Gets bigger fish on really slow topwater baits Recommends changing up your retrieve at least three times on each cast

Finds muskies chase casted baits less starting at 45°F and below Fishing deep is the next hot place to fish Green Bay was on in September and he heard three days in

November - the rest was really tough.
