number of us will be leaving Saturday morning from the Thunder Bay Grill and returning for the banquet.

We are scheduling speakers for the next two general meetings. For the April meeting, we have booked Duane Landmeier to speak on Illinois lakes. This should help us get a few of those early season fish. In April, Jeremy Venhuizen will also speak on Lake Storey, our first outing of the year on April 29. I will be in contact with our speaker for the May meeting later this week and I will confirm the presentation at the banquet.

Looking forward a little further, the Lake of the Woods trip looks like another week of Flatlanders comradery. We have 18 folks at Bay Store Camp and six others within casting distance on Oak Island. We may be able to squeeze in four more anglers on the trip - Contact Steve Ruhmann to confirm a spot. Make sure to check your passport and send off for your Remote Area Border Crossing permit as soon as possible.

We are also looking to fill up our teams for the Chapter Challenge on Lake of the Woods August 19-26.

#### **Rockford Gander Mountain survives**

Gander Mountain filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy and will close 32 of its 162 stores in 26 states. Rockford's store survived the cut, as did the Janesville and Madison stores that Flatlanders tend to go to. Gander Mountain closed stores in Champaign, Algonquin and Springfield in Illinois and Eau Claire and Germantown in Wisconsin. The St. Paul-Minnesota based company has put itself up for sale.

## Illini Muskie Alliance update

The Flatlanders are one of the 11 clubs and organizations that make up the Illini Muskie Alliance. Without the IMA, we probably wouldn't have musky fishing in Illinois. Besides promoting the fishery, IMA has helped the Illinois Department of Natural Resources during difficult economic times. In the last 10 years, IMA has donated more than \$55,000 to the DNR to meet its various needs.

The future of the DNR is murky. The department has half the number of employees it did in 2000 and critical areas such as the hatcheries are understaffed. For example, the Jake Wolf hatchery should have 24 employees. It has six – and two of them are expected to retire by the end of the year. There's a hiring freeze, so those employees will not be replaced anytime soon.

What can we do? We can write letters to our state senators and representatives letting them know how important the DNR is to us. I'm told that the letters need to be as positive as possible – extol the virtues of the DNR without criticizing the officials who got them in the hole that they are in.

Our first outing of the year is at Storey Lake. There wouldn't be muskies there without the DNR's stocking efforts or the IMA's support of the DNR.


