Musky fishing goes to college

Plenty of universities have had bass fishing teams compete in college tournaments such as the FLW Outdoors College Series, Carhartt Bassmaster College Bass Fishing Series and others. Now, walleye and musky fishing collegians will get their shot. Eight Midwestern colleges have formed the College Muskie & Walleye League. University of Minnesota Duluth, the College of St. Scholastica, Bemidji State University, University of Wisconsin-Stout, University of St. Thomas, University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, Western Illinois University and McHenry County College are signed up so far. The first tournament will be May 28 on Grindstone Lake near Hayward, Wisconsin. Organizers plan six musky tournaments and six walleye tournaments this year. There will be tournaments when both musky teams and walleye teams will fish the same lake. Check out www.collegemwleaque.com.

Boat registrations expire June 30

Make sure your boat registration is up to date. The Illinois Department of Natural Resources stopped sending out renewal notices in 2013. Registration of watercraft in Illinois is good for three years and expires June 30. There used to be a 10- to 12week backlog, but that's been cut to a more reasonable two weeks or so. Go to the DNR's website, dnr.illinois.gov., click on boating and go to the link "Please use Online Renewal if your boat is currently registered in your name." Follow the instructions from there.
