Barrier fence repair

The executive committee voted to donate \$200 to the Shabbona Lake Indian Creek Barrier fence repair project. The barrier keeps muskies in the lake rather than have them float downstream. Shabbona is one of the premier musky lakes in Illinois and we'd like to keep it that way.

Bass Pro may buy Cabela's

Cabela's wants to sell and it looks like Bass Pro is the leading suitor. The other option is for Cabela's to sell to a private equity firm. Bass Pro Shops earned more than \$4 billion in revenue last year and employs about 20,000 individuals in 94 retail stores. Cabela's reported \$1.2 billion in revenue last year and operates 77 retail stores.

No one really knows what this will mean to the fishing and hunting industry. There will be less competition overall, but since Cabela's and Bass Pro are so far apart in Illinois there's no direct competitive advantage. In other states, Cabela's stores that are in close proximity to Bass Pro probably will close.

Neither Cabela's nor Bass Pro are talking about what's next. My guess is that something gets done by the end of the year.

Pelican Lake update

Muskies were stocked in Pelican Lake, Minnesota, earlier this month. Last month I mentioned that there was a war brewing between homeowners on the lake and musky fishermen. The homeowners threatened to sue the DNR if it kept stocking muskies in Pelican, which is about a 4,000-acre lake.

A judge rejected a temporary restraining order from the homeowners and 813 muskie fingerlings were put into the lake Nov. 6.

The homeowners claimed the muskies were eating all their walleyes. Besides, women and children were afraid to go swimming because of big muskies.

The DNR's research showed the walleye population was as good as ever and that other species, bass, bluegills, crappie and perch, were doing very well. Perch, in fact, were at record levels. The only species that was down was northern pike.

Fishing guides contend that average walleye fishermen were having a tough time was because of the zebra mussels in the lake. The water is clearer, making it tougher to catch fish. They say tournament walleye anglers have been doing better on Pelican than they have on walleye lakes without muskies.

Homeowners are not guitting. They want more research on muskies in the lake and are considering more legal action.

The DNR tagged the recently-stocked muskies so they could study them. DNR officials the tagging had nothing to do with the recent controversy.

- To promote a high quality Muskellunge sport fishery
- To support selected conservation practices based on scientific merit and carried out by authorized federal and state agencies
- To promote Muskellunge research
- To establish hatcheries and rearing ponds and introduce the species into suitable waters
- To support the abatement of water pollution
- To maintain records of habits, growth and range of species
- To disseminate Muskellunge information
- To promote good fellowship and sportsmanship among men, women and children
