Last Thursday Andy Larson informed us there were muskies trapped below the dam at Rock



Cut State Park / Pierce Lake. With no flow coming over the dam and cold winter setting in, we were going to lose some valuable fish. A few phone calls and conversations started a muskie rescue last Sunday. The park staff was extremely supportive and appreciative of the idea. With the help of a couple of pumps we were able to lower the pool to attempt netting the land locked fish. Seven Flatlanders managed to net and put the game fish back into Piece Lake. In total the group rescued 8 muskies 18 - 37, 2 walleyes, 10 bass, 2 catfish and a few dozen panfish. Net man awards go to Leo Hauser with five, Kyle Scruggs with two, and Bob Cholke with one muskie. In all it was a great day and we would like to thank the staff at Rock Cut for their support.

With all that said, we will bring out the old "Toss the muskie in the hole" game Tuesday night - some call it cornhole and some call it bean bags. We will get our business taken care of and see which team has best hand eye coordination. For those of us that throw muskie lures up in the trees, it is a challenging evening. The December meeting will bring back our annual Christmas

Tails from Lake St. Clair

On Oct. 28, 29, three Flatlanders made their final trip to the "Musky Factory" for the 2019 season. Jeff Gayhart, Russ Hoernecke and Jack Pertz made the trek to St. Clair only to find that the "factory" was on plant shutdown. For their 2 day effort on the water, only 8 fish were boated and several more tried to get caught but somehow managed to escape. Apparently they were camera shy. On day one, only 4 fish were willing to come aboard! Jack led off with a 37 incher, followed by Russ boating a respectable 43 incher. Jeff was up and a rod got hit. We never got to see her, but she was pretty heavy. After a brief battle, she shoolk off! Just before calling it quits, Jeff and Jack doubled up on a pair of 40 inchers. Headlocks and Jointed Nils crankbaits were the hot baits on day one! The trio started day 2 at 7:30 a.m. It wasn't until 10:30 that a muskie decided to eat a White Faced Frog Ziggy. Russ was up and this fish was well worth the wait! She measured 50 inches and had a 21 inch girth and was beautifully marked. This was Russ's second 50 from St. Clair this year. Another couple hours went by before the next fish was boated by Jeff, a 38 incher caught on a 007 Ziggy. Two hours later, Jack had a "giant" hit. He got the fish near the boat and the mate was standing on the swim platform ready to apply the net. We estimated 52 inches! She surfaced, did a little headshake, and said goodbye. Shortly after that Jack boated a 41 incher, also caught on a 007 Ziggy. Russ graciously passed his next turn on to Jeff since Russ was feeling pretty pumped up after that 50 incher. Jeff boated the last fish of the day, a 32 incher caught on a Glitter Perch Headlock. At 3:00 p.m. the three headed in, happy with the few fish that were caught, especially Russ, and Jack and Jeff wishing they would have landed the ones that got away!
