Becky is strengthening her lead in the Women's Division by banging some fish on the surface measuring 36, 36, 39, and 35. She then went to Deer and stuck a 42 on a figure 8. Guide and netman Jerry got a chance at a couple and released a 33 and a 35 on Bone.

On a recent trip to the same area, Dick Estes released a nice 43-incher from the Apple River.

Men's Masters Division leader Jeremy Venhuizen has also been up north the last few weeks and got a 36 from Snipe. Rumor has it he borrowed his partner's lure and then showed him how to catch one on it. I have also been out too and was able to coax *Esox* of 33 and 34.5 munch my spinnerbait on Monona.

We then went to Deer the next day where I got a 43.5 and then on our last day headed to the Apple River where I suckered a 38 inch Tiger into the net.

Well that is it for this month. We still have 6-8 weeks of good fall fishing left. We should see some heavy weights stepping to the scales before it is over.

Walleye-musky war on Pelican Lake

Home and cabin owners on Pelican Lake, Minnesota, are threatening to sue the Department of Natural Resources unless it stops stocking muskies in the lake.

Members of the Pelican Lake Property Owners Association think muskies are eating all the walleyes in the lake and that's why they're not catching walleyes anymore.

"Our people are talking about selling their lake places," lake home owner Dave Majkrzak said in an Associated Press story. "We had one couple say, 'We can't catch a walleye on this lake anymore, we're going to sell our lake place and move someplace else.'" The DNR and fishing guides say the lake is healthy and there's no evidence musky are depleting the walleye population.

I think Jerry Sondag, a musky guide many of you know, sums it up best: "Here's what it is," Sondag said. "You have a bunch of retired guys who have nothing better to do. Because they're terrible fishermen, they're going to sit on their butts and persecute another group. (If) they want to learn how to fish, I'll take 'em fishing. It's \$500 a day. Jump in my boat and I'll teach you how to catch a fish."
