The 2017 PIT-TAG Challenge Outing Report

Copied from the Capital City Newsletter The annual CCMI PIT-TAG Challenge outing was held on September 23, 2017 on Lake Monona. The outing's goal was to catch as many muskies as possible with pit-tags to help bolster the data in the CCMI Leach Lake vs Wisconsin strain study. Forty-three fisherman, two from the Rockford Flatlanders club, participated on a day that topped 90° by the afternoon. Not surprising with the very warm temperatures the muskies were quite lethargic, as reported by many who had follows. Only two were caught. First place and travelling trophy was won by Marc Rortvedt who caught a 26 inch muskie which did not have a pit-tag. Second place and pit-tag winner was Dewey Stewart who caught a 20.25 inch muskie which did have a pit-tag. This was a leech lake fish that was stocked in April 2017 at 11.6 inches. This fish grew 9 inches in six months. After fishing the participants were treated to a brat and

hamburger picnic at Olbrich park. There were many red faces due to either embarrassment, for not catching a fish, or more likely being out in the blazing sun all day.

Help save Lake St. Clair

This email has been making the rounds. It originated with Spencer Berman, whom you might know from fishing shows and seminars. The Natural Resources Counsel of Michigan is planning to vote on a bill that would open Lake St. Clair up to a year round catch and release season. This would mean that anglers would be allowed to go out and target, catch, handle, and release prespawn and spawning muskies on a FULLY natural reproduction lake. The Lake St. Clair Guide Association along with the Michigan Ontario Musky Club and Muskie Inc. feel extremely strongly that this would DEVASTATE the musky population on St. Clair. I have talked to many biologists around the country and they all agree that this bill, if passed, could be hugely devastating to the Lake St. Clair musky population. For that reason we are asking everyone to please send an email to the N.R.C. stating that you DO NOT want year round musky fishing on the Lake St. Clair system. "As a musky enthusiast I feel strongly that I do NOT want a year round catch and release musky season on the Lake St. Clair System. In no way can I support fishing for prespawn and also spawning muskies. Bear in mind, St. Clair is a lake based solely on natural reproduction with no stocking of any kind. The impact of a year round season for muskies would alter the fishing to the point that serious musky anglers would chose to not return to Lake St. Clair after a few years of full time musky fishing!
