Our prefishing peaked on Tuesday with the tournament starting on Wednesday. Tuesday was the best day of the entire week with Duane Nichols leading off the team with a beautiful 50" fish, hitting a No. 5 Mepps Giant Killer. The fish stayed down for a long time and when

Duane said, "She is not hooked very well, you better try to get her as soon as you can." Lucky enough, the risky net job got her on the inside of the hoop and she got Duane and myself wound up. Lesson learned; don't be afraid to fish small baits. Congratulations Duane. To continue the stories, Wally stepped up with an unusual feat. Wally's personal best has been 48-inches for years. In fact he got a pair of 48s on the same day and same bait during one LOTW trip a few years back. Well he got very close to getting the shot from the "Flatlander's 50" Club" bottle but wound up short with a pair of 49.5s. What's special is that he got them both on the same day, the same spot and same bait. What an amazing set of events. Everyone else got fish that day except the guy that was trying to think what he should include in the newsletter article this

The results for the tournament did not include two of our fish so the board was in error. Wally's corrections indicated we were in the upper half of 27 teams. The numbers of fish were off from last year's amazing record but were the second best finish in the history of the Challunge. Big fish was 52 inches caught by the winning team, Star of the North.

The high water has some of the lakes shut down locally – Lake Monona. Waubesa was about 2-3 feet high on Wednesday morning with a nowake restriction. Water was over many piers. In the process of picking the lake for this week's trip, I checked out Swan Lake on Lake Link. We have heard stories of fish and big fish every

time we fish Swan Lake. Well last week a 49-incher was caught by a guy trolling within the first ten minutes. This confirms the stories and rumors of the lake for our next outing on Sept. 29. This is a very nice 400 acre lake with lots of hard weed edges, good flats, and plenty of deep water. I think you will like this lake if you have never fished it before. Consider staying overnight in the area and fishing Sunday. The lake will be chosen by the group Saturday night.

Make sure to attend the September meeting to catch up on latest reports and stories from the Chapter Challunge. We will also be voting on the outings for next year. We need your input to create a fun 2019 season. There will also be a discussion on Lake Namekagon for those attending our last outing that is the combined trip with the Wormsoakers. Last Thursday night the Wormsoaker's held their meeting to prep everyone for the outing. It was a very good meal with approximately fifty anglers talking about the upcoming trip. Gene Seuring also had his new sucker nose clip rig available for the late season sucker bite. This is the time of year for many informal trips. Talk to the group and try to line up some new spots with other Flatlanders. I have heard a few different groups talking about heading up to Green Bay. It would be fun and more productive if we were all up there at the same time.
